

Tri Town Rec Group February 23rd Meeting Minutes

Attendees: Ronna Gendron, Kirstie Patch, Cory St.Pierre, Theresa Darling, Jennasys Porter

1. Decided bank statements should be electronically sent to both Cory St.Pierre and Ronna Gendron. Cory agreed to get the needed paperwork from the bank to do so.

2. As mentioned in last meeting, a Facebook page will be put up for Tri Town Rec Group. Jessi Dussault agreed to create and manage it. The page will display Rec information to the public- no outside comments allowed. It will feature sign-up times and dates, game schedules, coach names and contact info, (only with the permission of each coach) and acknowledge sponsors.

Basketball:

3. It was voted “yes” to purchase basketballs next year.

4. Discussed creating a club basketball for k-2nd grade. ½ hour play time one weekend day a week. Sign-ups will be held but no fee will be charged.

5. Briefly discussed organizing refs for basketball next year. The athletics director at the high school should be contacted about kids reffing games.

6. Agreed that a concession table could be established at home games. Simple snacks and water offered.

Baseball:

7. Discussed sign-ups for baseball being held week of March 7th, (probably the 9th 3-5pm and the 9-11am). Kirstie Patch will hold sign-ups. Gazebo on the Millot will probably be the location.

8. The committee voted to hold firm to a minimum age of 5 by May 1st for t-ball.

9. Fees will be set at \$30 per child, \$45 per family.

10. The committee voted to charge an extra \$10 for late sign-ups.

11. Kirstie Patch will draft the fliers to advertise sign ups. Jennasys Porter agreed to contact school secretaries about the method of distribution. Theresa Darling agreed to inform home school families and Marlow schools. Cory St.Pierre will contact Orchard School, Surry Charter School.

12. Voted “yes” to acquire new catchers gear and mitts for minors and majors teams. Also voted “yes” to acquire 4-5 helmets for each team. The sign-up fliers will include an option for families to donate used equipment to Rec. After

inventory has been taken, Kirstie Patch will purchase what is needed.

13. A cleet swap was also suggested.

14. Voted “yes” to pay umpires as do other teams in the league.

15. Kirstie Patch offered to run a concession stand at the Millot for majors and minors games. Other parents will be invited to volunteer and contribute.

Softball:

16. Girls can play either baseball or softball. A girl's softball team will be offered, but if not enough girls sign-up, baseball is an option for those interested.

17. Coaching needs were discussed.
